Significant achievements have marked this year, inspiring stories of resilience, and unwavering support from all of you.

In our work with runaway children, we have continued our efforts to rescue and reunite them with their families, ensuring they are back in a safe and secure environment. Despite policy changes at the Union Government level, our commitment to these children remains steadfast.

The COVID-19 pandemic has profoundly impacted children, with its effects still visible three years later. Children who lost their family's breadwinners have been among the worst affected. We have helped these children continue their education and assisted surviving parents in establishing livelihoods. Having positively impacted 219 families, we successfully concluded this project in November 2023.

We launched a new initiative: a community centre in Pune that caters to children of single mothers and provides educational and psychological support. We have offered immediate assistance, academic support, and mental health services through targeted programs.

I am particularly proud of our staff's remarkable work. Their dedication, compassion, and commitment are truly inspiring. From rescuing runaway children to setting up community centres, their contributions are invaluable.

To our donors, we extend our deepest gratitude. Your generous support has been the backbone of our success. Your belief in our mission has enabled us to expand our reach and deepen our impact.

As we move forward, we remain committed to our vision of a just and equitable society. Your support and trust are the pillars of our success, and we are deeply grateful for your continued partnership.

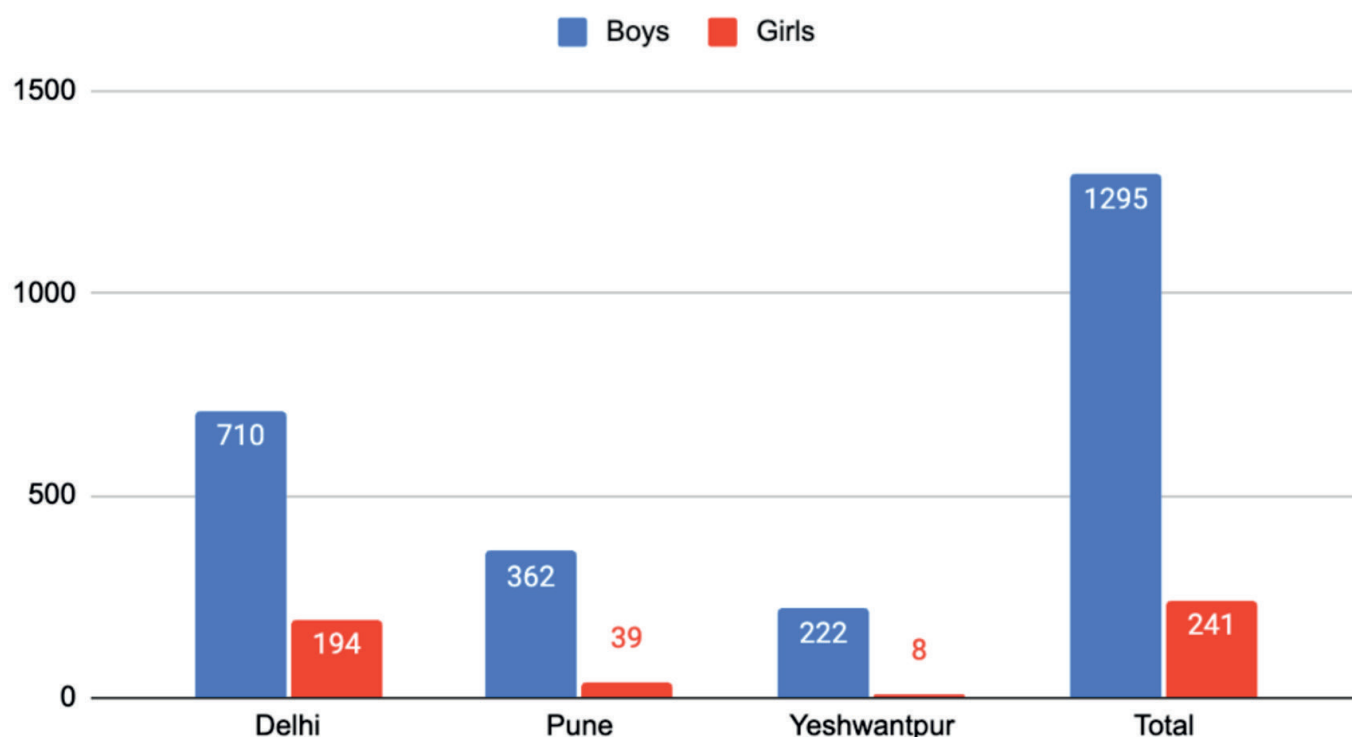

1. Working with Children in Contact with Railways

Our program for children in contact with railways encompasses three key aspects: outreach, shelter, and restoration. The achievements in these areas are detailed below.

Outreach: Regular outreach operations are ongoing at Pune and Delhi stations. Our operations at Yeshwantpur ceased in August 2023. The effectiveness of outreach is measured by the number of children rescued. In the last year (2023-24) we have rescued 1535 children between April 23 and March 24. Notably, the number of children rescued in Delhi spiked in April due to a joint rescue drive conducted at the station, while a similar increase occurred in Pune in June during another rescue operation.

Children Rescued by SATHI in 2023-24



All the girls rescued last year by SATHI, have been restored to their families with support of local NGOs and Police.

Of the boys rescued, 52% (798) were brought to SATHI Shelters in Delhi and Pune. 25% (396) were reunited with their parents directly from the platform, while 22% (340) were referred to other NGOs by the Child Welfare Committee (CWC).

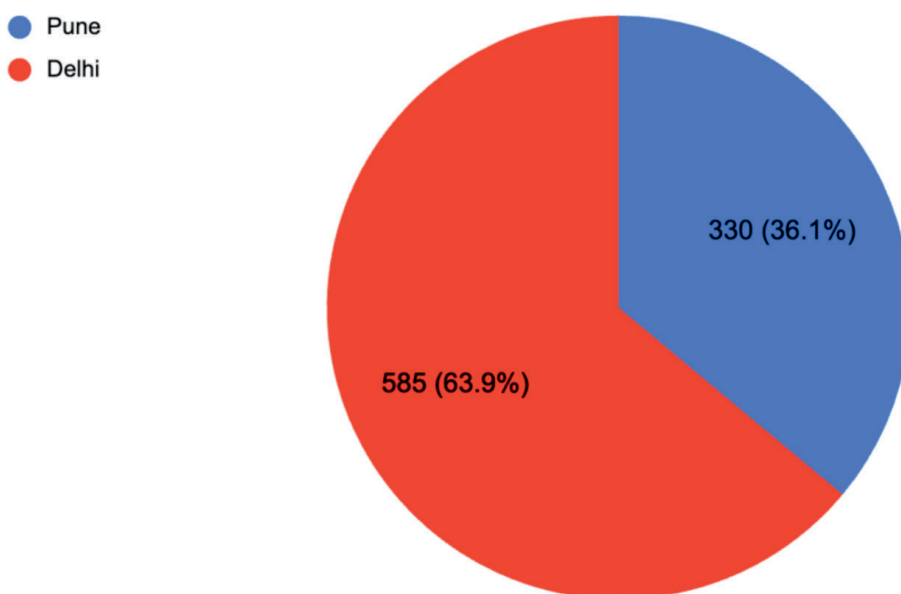
An important part of outreach is interacting with stakeholders. Our outreach team engages with various railway station stakeholders, including the Railway Protection Force, Government Railway Police, Station Managers, Ticket Collectors, Vendors, and Porters. Continuous interaction ensures they know to contact us when encountering an unaccompanied child or a challenging case.

Challenges in Outreach: One of our biggest challenges this year was the closure of outreach at Yeshwantpur station. In 2022, the Dept of Women and Child Development merged the Children's helpline 1098 with the national helpline 112, and directed all Childline units to be state-managed. Consequently, SATHI had to close its Railway Childline operations at Yeshwantpur. However, after multiple follow-ups, in January 2024, SATHI secured permission to place two staff members at the station for outreach.

The closure of operations at Yeshwantpur has had a direct effect on our numbers for outreach.

Shelter: SATHI Shelters under Mission Vatsalya are functioning in Pune and Delhi. Boys rescued by SATHI and those who come to the shelter through the orders of the Child Welfare Committee (CWC).

Children in the shelter have access to necessities like food, shelter, and clothing. They also engage in various activities including Non-Formal Education, Dance, Art, Storytelling, and Yoga.

At both shelters, we celebrated significant national days like Independence Day, Republic Day, Gandhi Jayanti, and Children's Day. We also embraced cultural festivals including Eid, Raksha Bandhan, Ganesh Chaturthi, Diwali, Christmas, and Saraswati Puja. Additionally, we observed UN-designated days such as World Day Against Child Labour, World Day Against Trafficking in Persons, World Environment Day, and Earth Day. These celebrations highlighted the cultural richness and importance of these occasions.



Volunteer Programs at the Shelter

In October 2023, MasterCard employees visited the Pune shelter, donating clothes, groceries, and other essentials. They also spent time with the children and participated in craft activities. Team members from the Bhoomi Foundation created wall art in both shelters, adding colour and positively enhancing the atmosphere.



Pune Shelter Awarded

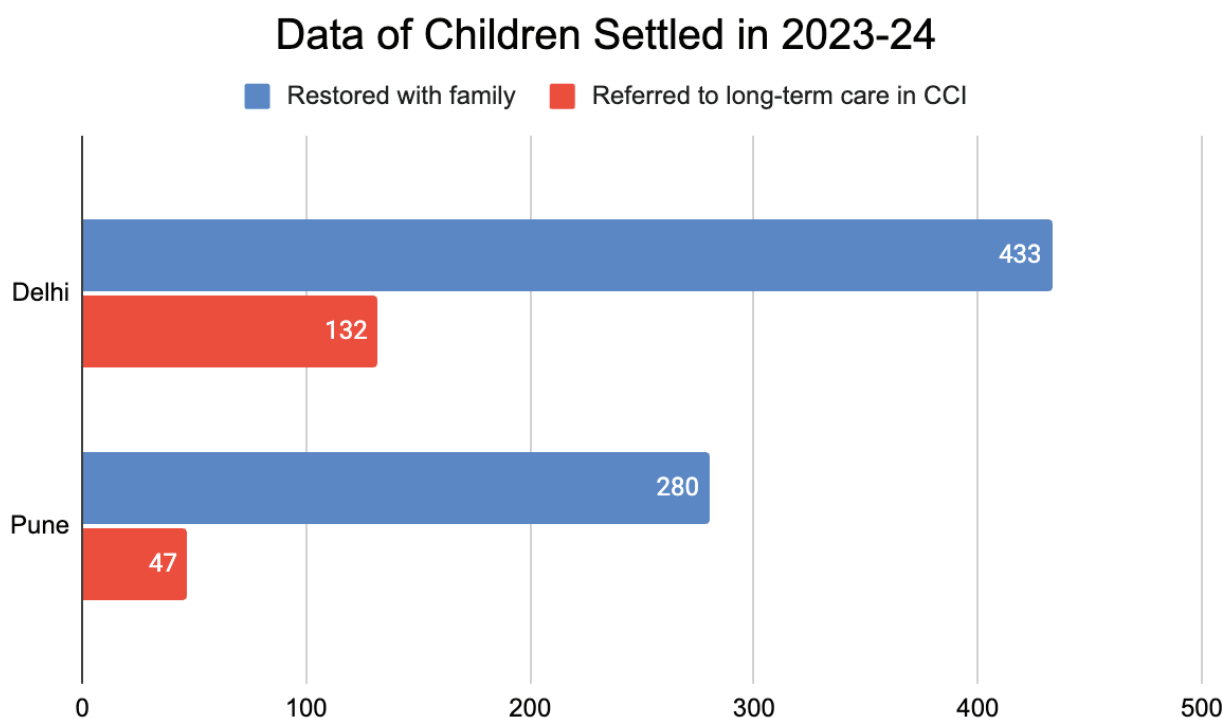
The open shelter at Pune was recognised as the **‘Best Open Shelter Home’** in Maharashtra. For this we were given the Bal Snehi award by the Government of Maharashtra in November 2023.



Restoration and Placement of Children:

The ultimate goal with each child is to restore him to his family. This is the most challenging aspect of our work, involving multiple stakeholders. Each step of the process requires reporting to the Child Welfare Committee (CWC), and the final decision requires their approval.

Of the 915 boys at the SATHI shelter in 2023-24, 892 were restored. The chart below shows how many returned home and how many were referred to long-term Child Care Institutions.



As seen from the above chart, 719 (79%) of the children from the Pune and Delhi shelters were reunited with their families. We also conducted a telephonic follow-up with the restored childrens' families. The results of this follow-up show that 95% of those restored by SATHI in 2023-24, continued staying at home.

Constant Comparison: A Bane for Kohinoor

On August 17, 2023, SATHI encountered Vikram, a confused and angry teenager from Ludhiana, on the platform steps. After completing du procedures at the station we brought him to the shelter.

Vikram had worn his school uniform, from his belt, we traced the school and called them. We discovered that Vikram, whose real name was Kohinoor Pandey, had run away from home. Kohinoor's father was notified through the school's contact, and although

Kohinoor was initially uncooperative, he was later calmed and agreed to counseling. Kohinoor shared that constant comparisons with his academically successful siblings had led to his decision to run away. After being reprimanded by his father for sleeping instead of studying on Independence Day, Kohinoor left home, boarding multiple trains to reach Delhi. During counseling, it was revealed that the comparison with his siblings was the primary issue.

SATHI facilitated a reconciliation between Kohinoor and his father. The father acknowledged the detrimental impact of the comparisons and promised to cease them. On August 18, 2023, after a successful joint counselling with father and son, Kohinoor was sent home with his father.

Rescuing A Teenager from Child Labour Racket

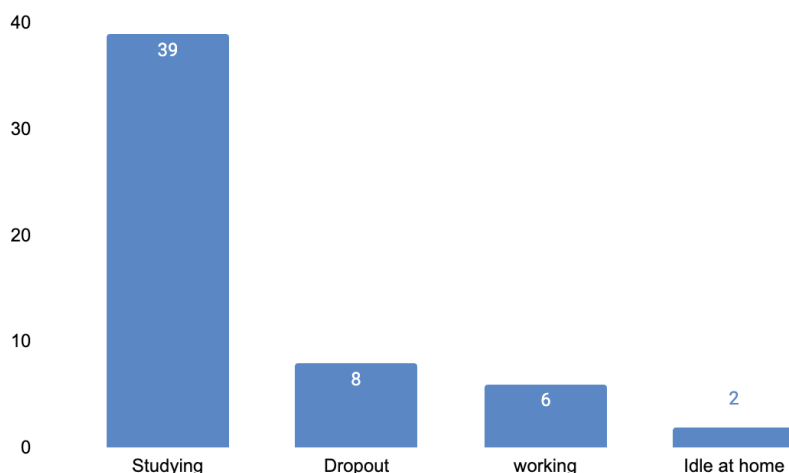
On April 20, 2023, SATHI encountered 14-year-old Chandan at Yeshwantpur station, where he was found with another minor, both claiming to be brothers searching for work. The villagers accompanying the boys claimed otherwise. When

SATHI checked the boys' Aadhar cards we found discrepancies. Despite receiving threats, SATHI took the boys to the help desk and later to the CWC, where Chandan expressed regret and a desire to return home. After a warning from the CWC about the dangers of child labor, Chandan was sent back with one of the villagers. A follow-up confirmed that Chandan had safely returned home.

Home Visits of Restored Children

In March 2024 a physical follow-up was conducted for the children restored from the Pune shelter in 2022-23. The purpose of this follow-up was to determine if the children had successfully settled back into their homes and to identify any need for educational support. We visited the homes of 55 children and the results are as follows:

Family Reunion Program in Pune and New Delhi

A family reunion program is a larger event when the families of many children are invited to one place and reunited with their runaway/lost children. Last year, we organized two family reunion events. The first, on July 17, 2023, was organised in Pune. Mrs. Shefali Bajaj from Bajaj Group; Mr. Kurush Irani, President - CSR, Bajaj Finserv Ltd.; other team members of Bajaj and CWC members attended the event. We reunited 11 children at this event.

A similar event in Delhi in August 2023 included representatives from Bajaj Finance, CWC, DCPO, RPF, and Roop Automotives Ltd. SATHI reunited 8 children with their families. Two children restored in 2019-20 shared their experiences as runaways and their current happier lives at home.

Educational materials were distributed to all the children, emphasizing the importance of education. During both events, speeches by various attendees helped children understand the significance of staying at home and the empowering role of education.

Community Centre at Tadiwala

SATHI's new open shelter in Pune, is near the Tadiwala Road community. We conducted a survey in December 2023 to assess the needs of orphaned children and those with single parents. The findings revealed a need for educational support, which led to the opening of a community center. Currently, 27 children regularly attend, receiving help with Math, English, and Marathi, along with essential life skills such as problem-solving, resilience, teamwork, and decision-making.

Post Restoration Support Program

We have organized a Post Restoration program for restored children and their parents on 21st March 2024 at the office of DRM, Central Railway Pune. A total of 36 children have been supported with education materials, fees, uniforms etc.

Rescue Drives

A rescue drive is a week-long, 24/7 operation at railway stations, jointly conducted by NGOs and stakeholders to estimate the number of children arriving at the station. These drives also help refine rescue strategies. In 2023-24, we organized a rescue drive in Pune (June 2023) to assess child inflow. A similar drive at Manmad Junction in March 2024 evaluated the need for intervention at this key station.

Training and Events Conducted by SATHI

1. In November 2023, a State-Level Capacity Building Training was held in Bangalore for 60 railway officials, 45 railway childline staff, and the District Child Protection Unit. Experts discussed child rescue responsibilities, challenges, and legal aspects under the Juvenile Justice Act. Practical insights from CRT's experience were shared, equipping participants with valuable knowledge for future child rescue operations.
2. On March 19, 2024, SATHI, in collaboration with the District Women and Child Development Department and Catalysts for Social Action (CSA), held a one-day training on the Juvenile Justice Act, 2015, for 48 staff members from 18 Child Care Institutions in Pune. Led by Mr. Dipesh Sokase (Advocacy Manager, CSA) and Mr. Rajveer Singh (Project coordinator, SATHI), the session covered Child Protection Mechanisms, Case Management, Documentation, and Rehabilitation Planning.
3. On March 21, 2024, an educational support program was held at the Divisional Railway Manager's office in Pune, attended by senior railway officials, and staff from Bajaj CSR and Bajaj Finserv. 29 previously restored children received educational kits, and 11 were also supported with school fees. Guests encouraged the children to pursue education, stressing its importance for their future and urging them to continue their studies.



2. Support for Children and Families Affected During Covid Pandemic

In 2022-23, SATHI successfully implemented a COVID-19 support project for children from marginalized families in Karnataka. Impressed by the initiative, Bajaj Finserv funded a similar project in Pune in 2023. SATHI approached the District Child Protection Unit (DCPU) office for data on children who had lost their parent/parents due to the pandemic.



This data revealed that 3,453 children in Pune district had lost a parent due to the pandemic, with 2,193 in Pune urban. The project focused on supporting children in Pune urban for easier implementation.

Working with 2,193 children was a monumental task, so we conducted an assessment of 534 families. The goal was to evaluate their financial status and identify their needs for assistance in areas like education, entrepreneurship, and skill training.

Based on the results, families were categorized into three groups:

- ❖ **Category A:** Families in urgent need of assistance.
- ❖ **Category B:** Families in need of financial aid but less critical.
- ❖ **Category C:** Families managing well without additional support.

In total, 189 families fell into Categories A and B, encompassing 308 children.

The entire project had 5 key activities which are detailed below:

- 1. Orientation Camps:** After shortlisting families, we organized 4 orientation camps for parents and children. These camps allowed us to understand their needs and issues, providing adults with information on vocational training, business opportunities, and government schemes. Students participated in art and quizzes, while older children received career counselling.
- 2. Entrepreneurship Support:** We provided tailored assistance to single parents, helping 31 successfully launch and grow their businesses through mentorship and financial support, fostering financial stability and self-reliance.
- 3. Counselling:** Professional counselling services were provided to 534 of our beneficiaries, resulting in notable improvements in their emotional well-being and resilience.
- 4. Skill Training:** A specialised skill training workshop was held for 25 participants aged 16-20 to explore career opportunities. Resource persons from Bhartiya Yuva Shakti Trust and TATA Strive provided training on business management and employment-oriented skills, respectively.
- 5. Business Camp for Single Mothers:** We organised a one-day business workshop for 22 women entrepreneurs to help them expand and sustain their small businesses. The workshop focused on maximising profits, improving product quality, marketing strategies, and optimal pricing. Resource persons from Deep Grah and Bhartiya Yuva Shakti Trust facilitated the event.

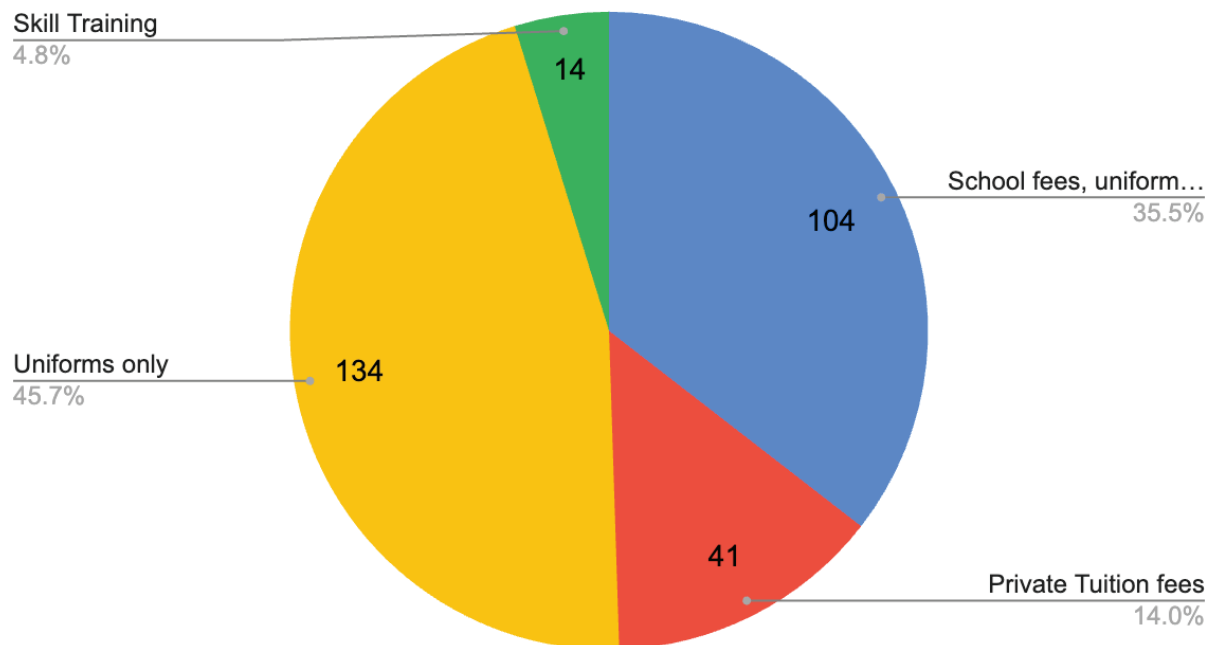
Beneficiary Testimonial

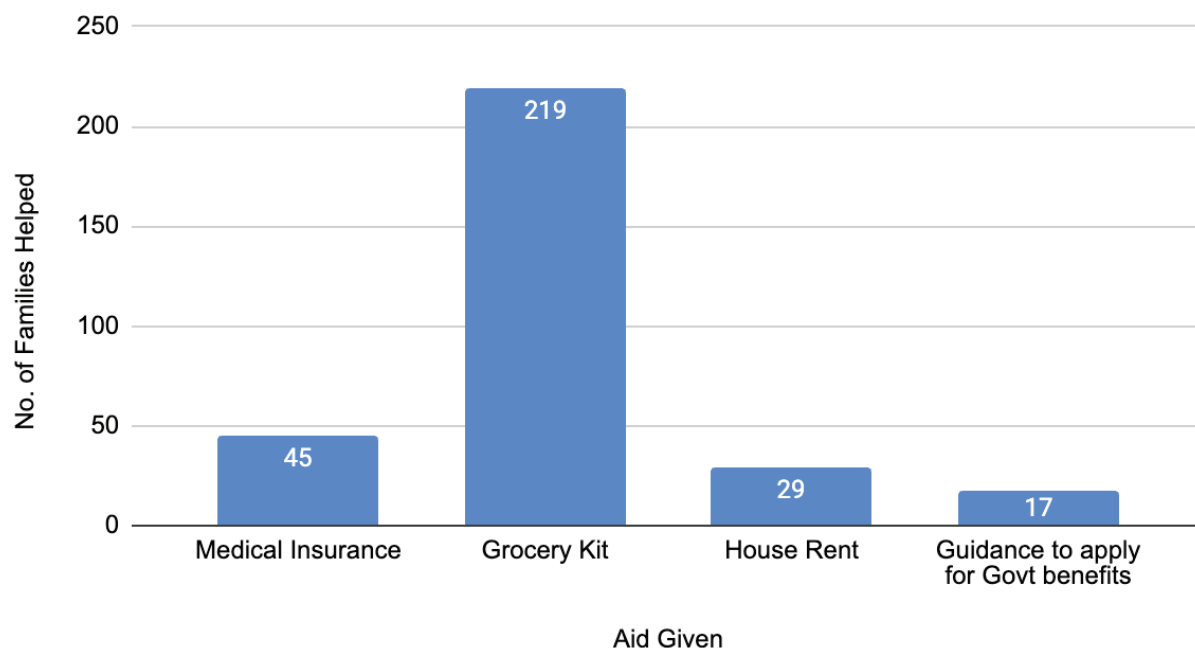

Along with this 31 single mothers were helped with financial assistance to sustain their businesses.

Overcoming Loss: Jyoti's Struggle for Stability After COVID-19

Pravin, a bus driver earning around ₹10,000 - ₹15,000 per month, lived with his wife Jyoti, daughter Anushka, and young son Prabhas in a flat he purchased on loan in Vadholi. Being supportive, he invited his brother to move from their village to Pune, securing him a job and sharing their home.

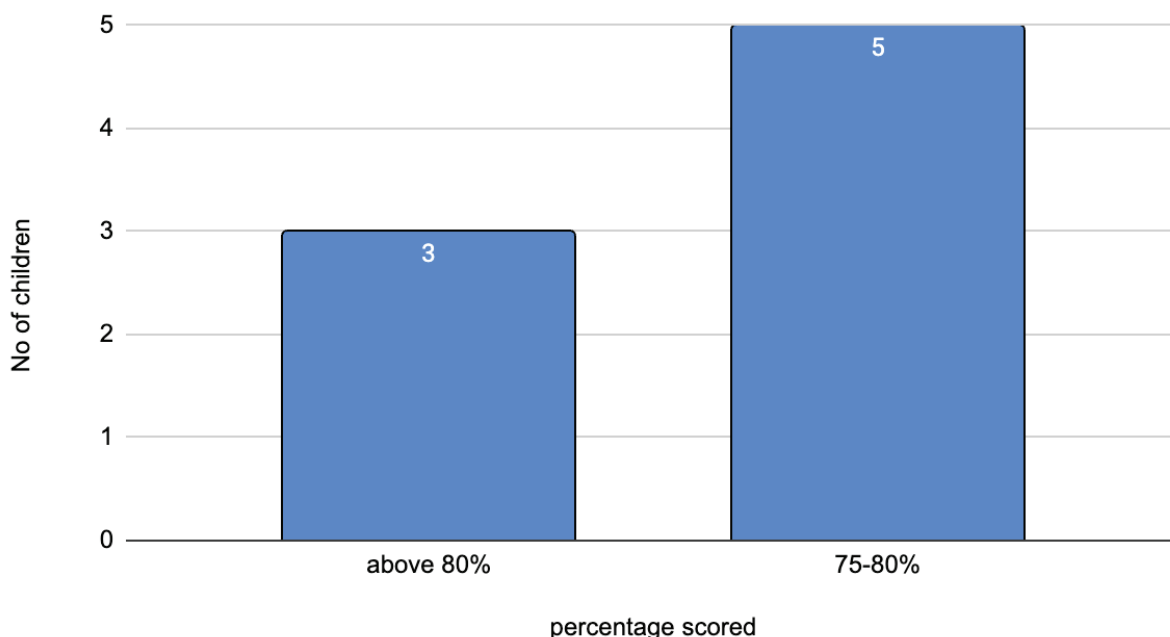
Tragically, Pravin succumbed to COVID-19 during the second wave, leaving Jyoti devastated and in shock. Her mother took her and the children home to recuperate. Upon returning to Pune, Jyoti faced hostility from Pravin's brother, who refused to let her enter their home, now claiming it as his own. After a year of constant conflicts, the brother left, taking some of Pravin's belongings.

Jyoti now lives alone with her children, earning about ₹5,000 a month through small jobs like stitching, ironing, and cooking within her society. Though Pravin's insurance cleared the home loan, Jyoti struggles to pay society maintenance fees and school fees for her children. She received some government aid, including ₹50,000 from the PM COVID Care Fund and Bal Sangopan for her children.

SATHI has stepped in to support Jyoti by covering Anushka's school fees, providing a medical insurance policy, and offering a grocery kit, school bag, and stationery for the children.

Eight Children supported under the COVID project have successfully passed their Class X board exams, achieving first class and above.

Class X Results of Children Supported Under COVID Project

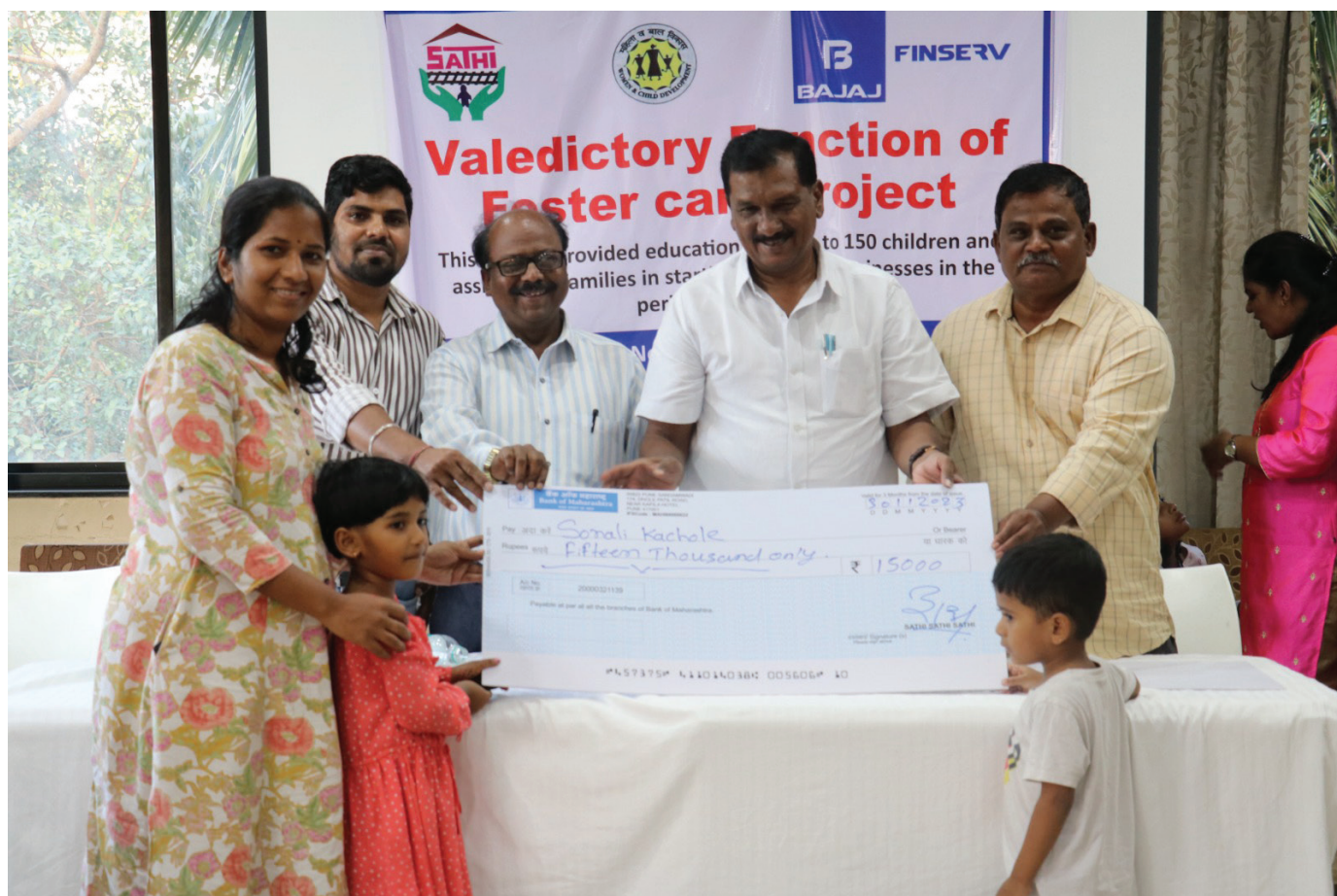


Update on “We Care For You” COVID Project of Chikkaballapur, Karnataka

After March 2023, SATHI had Rs. 5,83,212 remaining from Synamedia's donation for COVID-affected children. We used these funds for:

- **Educational Support:** Covered school fees for 25 children facing financial difficulties.
- **Emotional Support:** Continued counselling for individuals struggling with grief from losing close family members.

On October 17, 2023, we held a valedictory function for the project, providing education kits to 25 families. Government officials praised SATHI's efforts in supporting children's education.

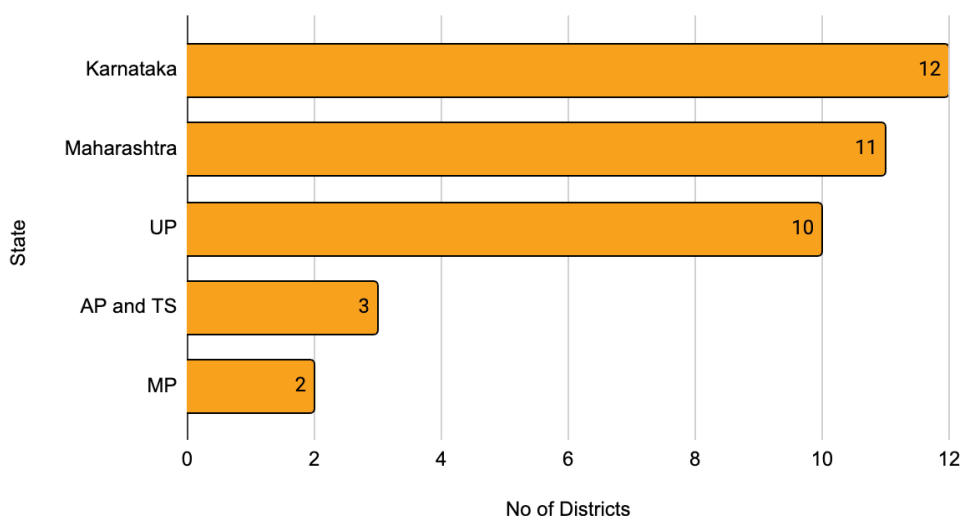


3. Nurturing Academically Merited Students of the Government Schools

In 2020, SATHI launched an educational initiative In Karnataka for talented students from financially disadvantaged backgrounds, focusing on those excelling in NMMS and NTSE exams. The program, which has now been extended to Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, and Uttar Pradesh, aims to improve academic performance and secure professional course admissions.

Selection: We collaborate with the Department of Education to identify students scoring over 100 in NMMS exams. After obtaining school consent, we offer free online coaching and conduct assessment tests to select students for the program.

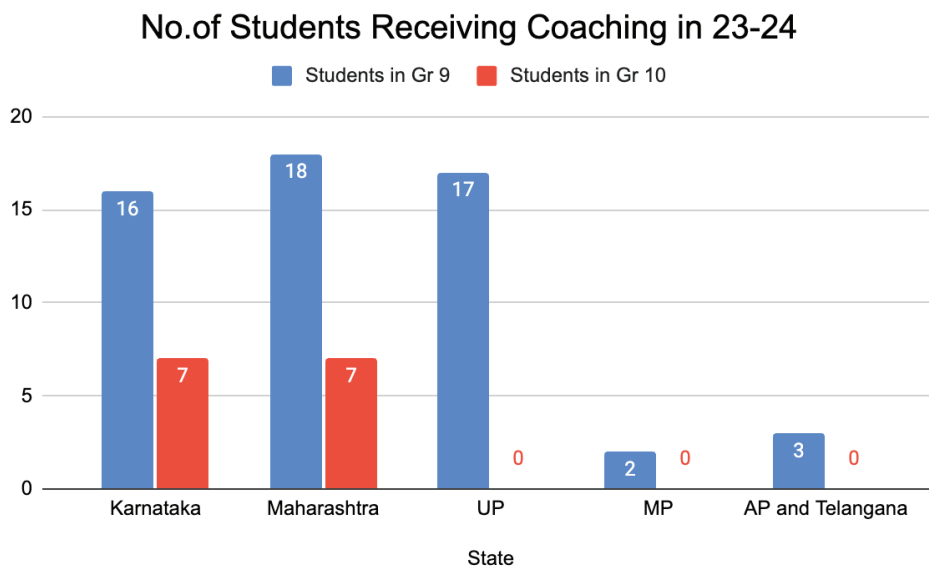

Orientation events were held across states to build trust in the free educational coaching program and discuss career options. Last year's events included:

- **Kanpur:** the meeting was held within the premises of IIT-Kanpur with a campus tour.
- **Pune:** Students enjoyed a hands-on science experience and model building with Mr Lewitt from Life Labs at Deepgruh Society, and also visited IISER Pune.
- **Karnataka:** Campus tour at Deeksha Institute, Art of Living Centre, Jawaharlal Planetarium, and Indian Institute of Space Science and Technology.

Details of Students Being Coached by SATHI

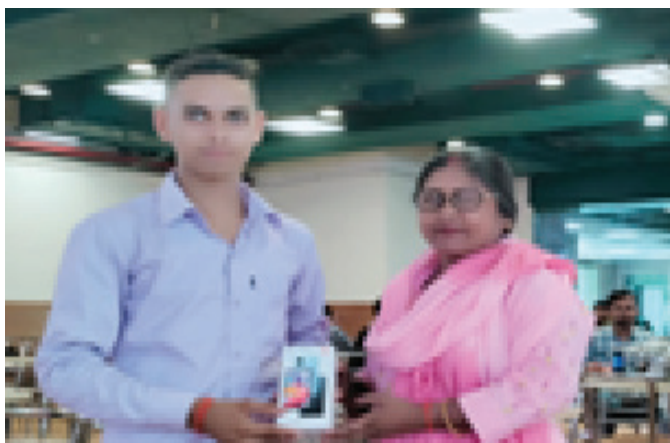
70 students studying in classes 9 and 10 are being coached by SATHI. The state wise details is as below



Resource Persons, Class Mode and Materials Provided: The project has 13 expert resource persons teaching Physics, Chemistry, Biology, and Maths online with a strict no-video policy for safety. Students receive NCERT Exemplar books for grades 7-10 and NTSE books with the past five years' questions in Maths, Physics, Chemistry, and Biology.

Providing Smartphones

To support dedicated students who missed classes due to lack of smartphones, SATHI provided them with devices, enabling regular attendance



Progress in the last three years: The growth and progress made by the students in the last three years are inspiring and motivating too. **Ningamma is one such student.**

Her journey highlights the success of SATHI's educational support. In November 2020, during a volunteer stint, Mr. Pramod Kulkarni the founder of SATHI identified Ningamma as a bright student from an economically weak

background in Tumkur. Despite the pandemic, Mr Kulkarni's online coaching helped Ningamma excel, scoring 99.33% in her 10th board exams in 2022. She ranked 6th in the state and secured free admission at Deeksha Integrated PU College. In March 2024, Ningamma achieved 97% in her 12th exams and ranked 2400 in JEE Mains (SC category). She is expected to pursue Electrical and Electronics Engineering at NITK-Surathkal, inspiring others with her achievements.

4. Hope works - Scholarship Program

SATHI is partnering with Hope Works Foundation to offer scholarships for girls from financially weak families. Hope Works interviews applicants and their families to assess motivation and commitment. Selected students receive career guidance, choose their courses, and are awarded a 50% scholarship, with the remainder covered by their families. In the first year, 20 girls benefited from this scholarship program.

5. Working With Migrant Families

SATHI supports 1247 families in working with migrant families along Bannerghatta Road, divided into two sections: Jayadeva Hospital to Bannerghatta Road and Vega City Mall to Goragunte Palya. Karmika Gourava Kendras (KGKs), modelled after ILO Worker Facilitation Centres, assist migrants.

We hold cluster and district meetings at KGKs to educate workers on labor laws, government schemes, and unions, and help with documents and IDs. Health camps and International Labour Day celebrations are also organized.

The project, which has reached 5,000 workers, has expanded to Old Madras Road, now including construction, domestic, and housekeeping workers.

6. Annual Meet

In June 2023, SATHI's annual staff meeting took place at the Nirjhari Conference Centre, Bengaluru, with 46 staff members from Pune, Delhi, and Bangalore. The event included training on project management, team building, and emotional intelligence, with sessions led by experts and leisure activities like cultural events and sightseeing.



7. Governance and Administration

Annual General Body Meetings

The Annual General Body Meeting of SATHI was held on 22nd June 2023 at SATHI Office, Mathikere, Bangalore. The Audit Report was submitted to all the members and the financial statements for the annual filing of returns to Registrar of Societies were approved by the board along with continuation of Shenoy & Kamath Chartered Accountants as auditor for the year 2023 – 24.

Governing Body Meetings

Two Governing Board Meetings were held during this year on 30th May 2023 and on 20th December 2023.
